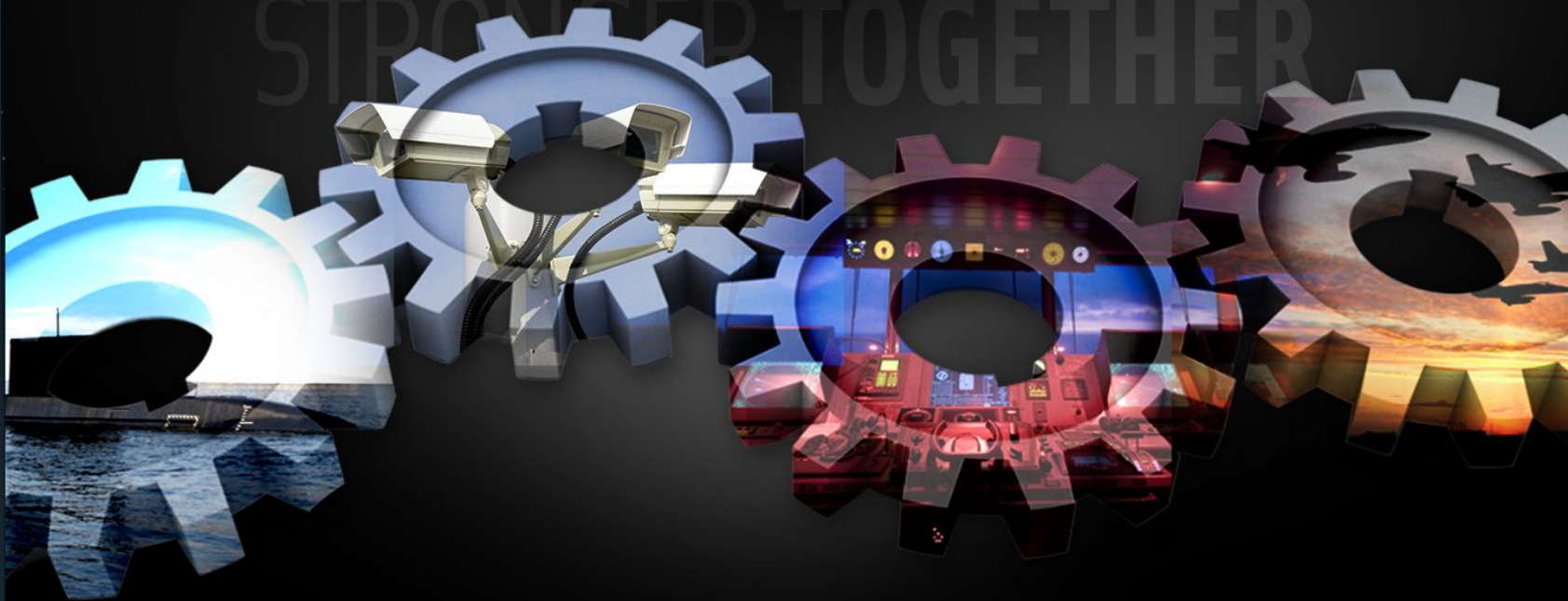

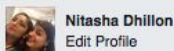

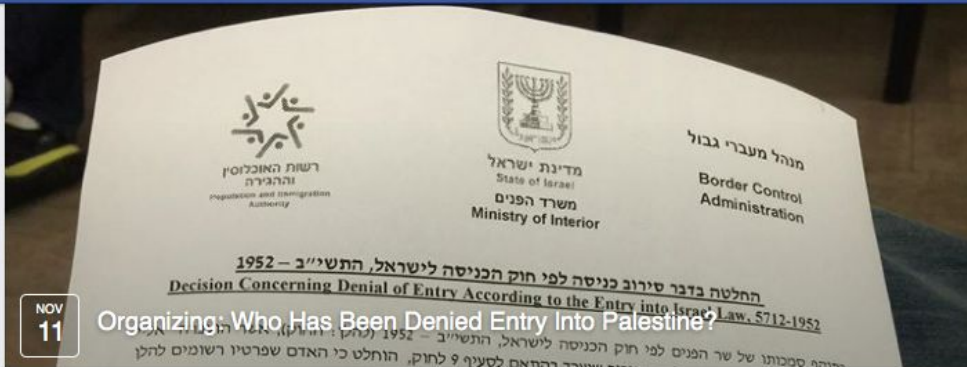

I was denied entry into Palestine via Tel-Aviv on October 10, 2015 while returning to visit family and friends in these difficult times. I was deported by Israeli Authorities after 15 hours of detention, interrogation, being strip searched and subjected to a body cavity search. I was deported (in the words of Israel) for the "prevention of illegal immigration" and "public security or public safety or public order consideration." I was escorted onto an Alitalia to Rome with my U.S. Passport handed over to the flight Captain with instructions to return my passport only once we have landed.

Palestine is where I was raised and it is where my home, family and people are. Below are some pictures of our house in Al-B... [See More](#)

UPDATE 2: I have received many stories similar to mine, and each is a catastrophe inflicted by Israel. This is Arwa H. Abdallah's story with all the texture of how she was denied the right to return home:

I've been having a hard time articulating my thoughts. I went to Jordan this summer to work with a few NGO's in the Palestinian refugee camps and analyze the health care system and processes. I decided that I can't make it all the way to Jordan and not go to Palestine so I waited until my dad arrived to Jordan and we headed out the next day. It was a Thursday, we were planning on only going for 4 days and coming back with my aunt from Beit Sahour (my hometown). The taxi driver dropped us off at the Malik Hussein border crossing and gave us his contact info just in case we were sent back. We moved quickly through the Jordanian side, no problems whatsoever. We got onto the buses that take you across the border and before I knew it we were in a line outside to initially process our passports. We went in, waited in another line, went through metal detectors. Then we went into a bigger room, stood in a third line to get a paper that told us which lines we needed to stand in next. We were told to go to window number 12. We stood in line in front of an empty window until an Israeli employee decided to come and begin processing our passports. I was standing right behind my dad and behind me was a mom and her 3 daughters. I remember thinking that she was uncomfortably close to me and I just wanted her to step back just a little. But then she started conversing with me and I felt bad for being irritated by her. The Israeli guy processed my dad's American passport quickly with no problem. Then my dad handed him my good-for-nothing American passport. The guy, disgusted, looks at my dad and says "who's this" my dad's like "My daughter? She's right behind me". So he does something with my passport on his computer. His eyes automatically widened, he moved away from his computer, then moved close and just kept scrolling and scrolling and scrolling. My dad says to him that we're only staying for 4 days to which the Israeli guy replies "ha, that's IF you get in". He then hands me a questionnaire and instructs me to sit down and fill it out and wait to be summoned for questioning. I waited for 1.5 hours until 2 Israeli "officials" in plain clothes, one guy and one girl come and take me to the back. The guy takes my questionnaire and starts going through the questions. He was

left and came back (my phone never left the room). She came back and started asking me about the protests for Gaza last year, she asked me if I organized them I said no? Then she showed me a picture of myself wearing a black scarf, carrying a banner at one of last year's protests. Then all of sudden she's like "I want you to hear something" I said okay and then the sound of a recording filled the room, it was the sound of me and one my colleagues lecturing at a UIC SJP lecture series early 2014. Shocked I was like "it seems like that's my voice" she's like "yes" I asked her how'd you get that? She's like "nothing you do is private". She kept asking me about my job the same way the guy before her did, and I told her that "everything I do is legal, I also pay taxes that support "Israel" against my will" Then I sat for another hour until she came out again and told me to go back to the seating area. I waited and saw everyone before get their passports and visas. My

Decision Concerning Denial of Entry According to the Entry into Israel Law, 5712-1952
