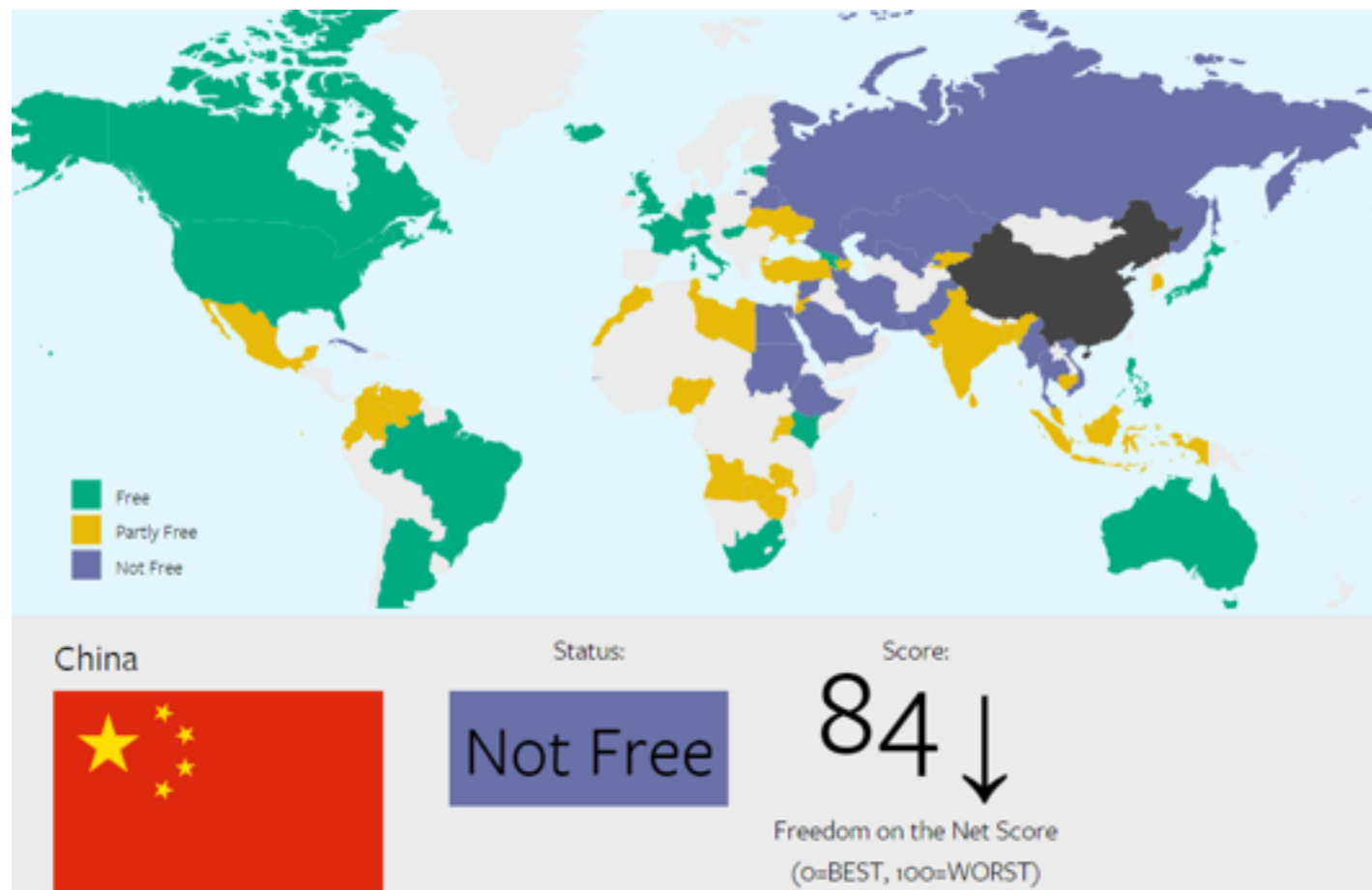

Internet Censorship in China

largest population of Internet users

- 1.3 billion microblog account holders;
- 600 million WeChat account holders

least degree of online freedom

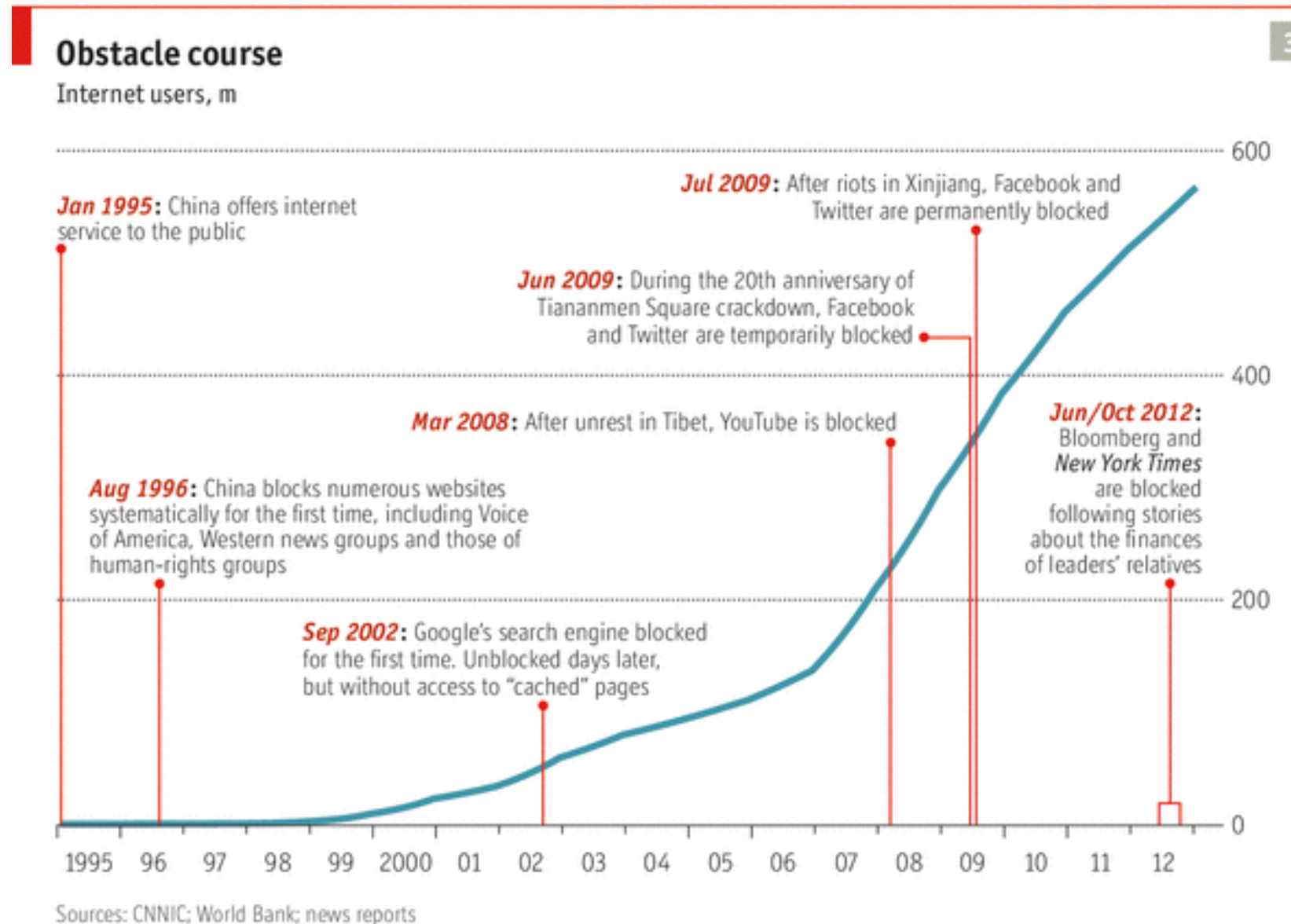
How does China censor the internet?

Criteria for censoring the Internet

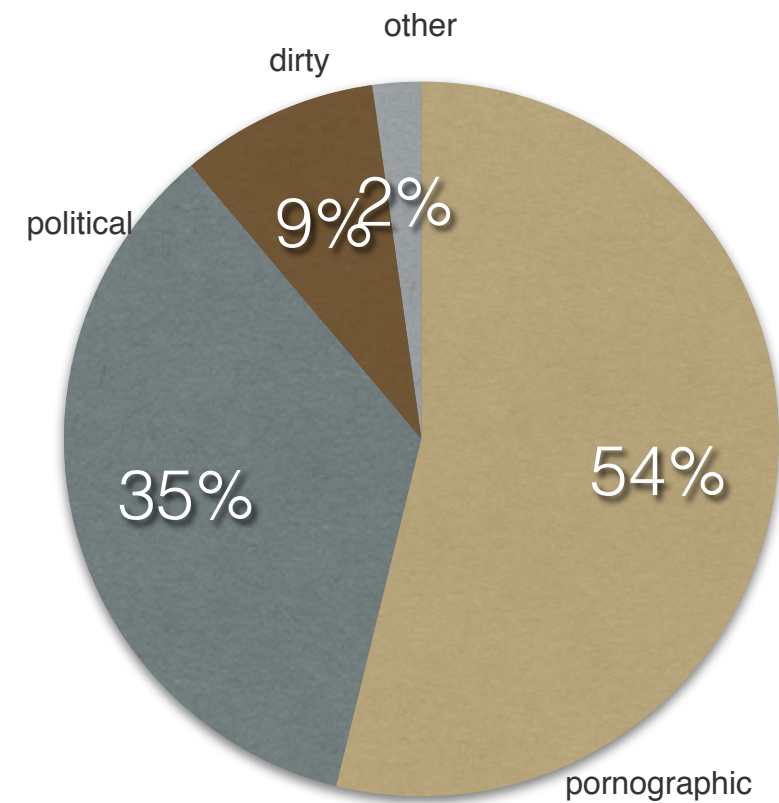


- do not jeopardize social stability,
- do not organize activities that threaten the party.

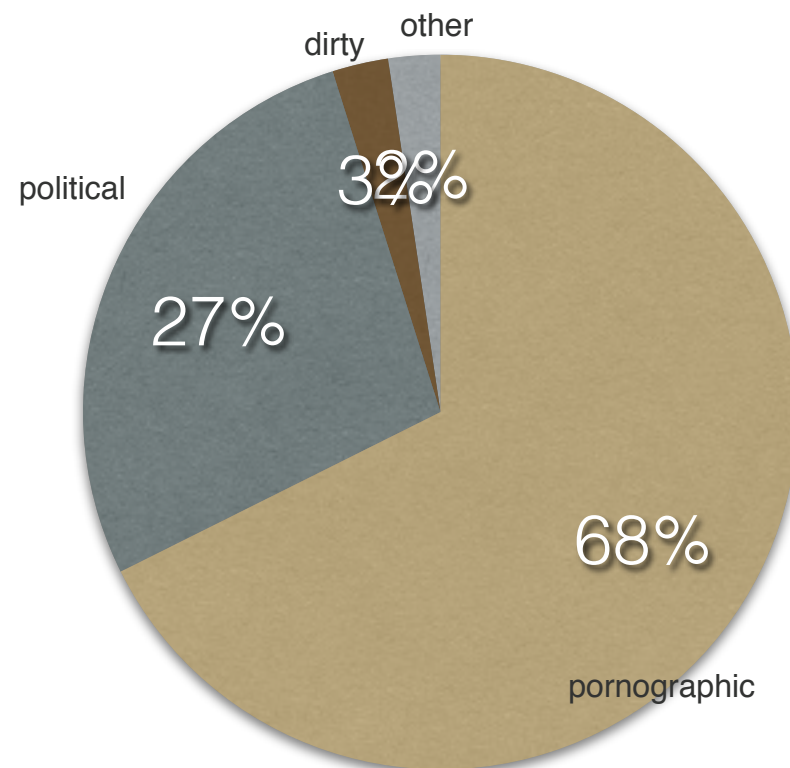
Lists of restricted keywords

- Tom Skype (Chinese version)
- VeryCD
- All for football

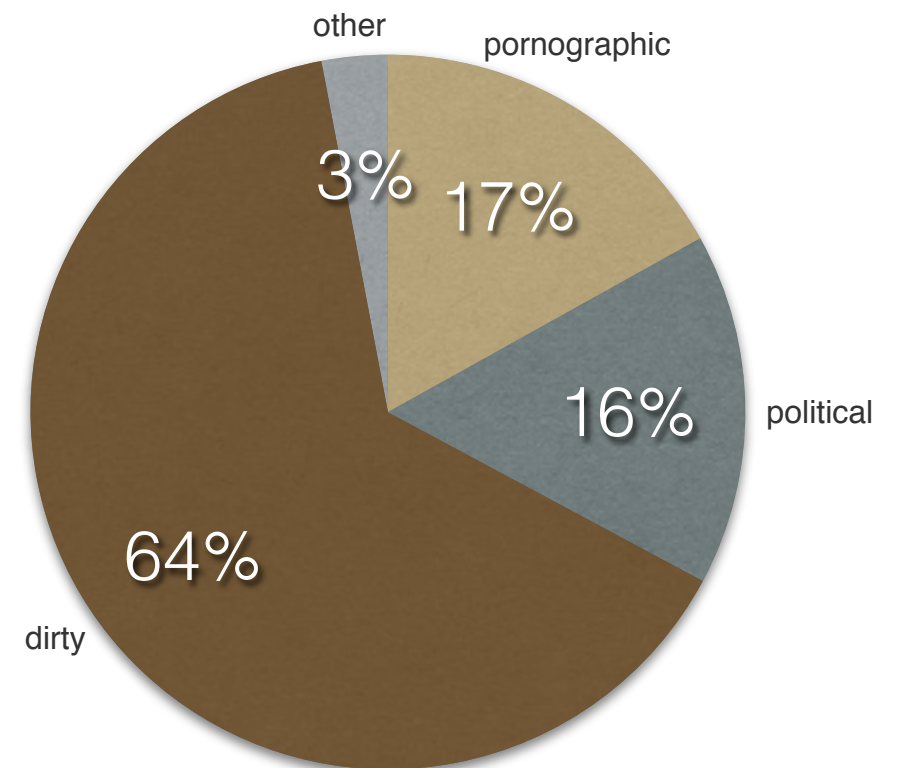
Categorizing the banned words



Tom-skype list



VeryCD list



All for Football list

Avoid the censoring of political content

1. Creating the list of banned keywords

- words referring to political content mark as “p”
- the overlapping words

2. Creating the replacement vocabulary

- coded words
- can be understood by most people

3. Write a sensitive keywords filter

- replace banned words into safe words

How to create coded replacing word

- similar pronunciation



How to create coded replacing word

- **Emoticons**
- original: “江泽民”
- replacement: “O-O”



How to create coded replacing word

- **add or cut some strokes, make it a different character but has similar shape**
- Tiananmen Square Protest of 1989
- original: 天安门
- replacement: 大安门
- 天 → 大



How to create coded replacing word

- **Use other language**
- original: 共产党
- English: The Party

The results of extreme censorship

- **self-regulation**
- e.g. Google sensitive word list posed on *Github*
- Foucaultian mode
- **counter effect**
- distrust to the government
